# **Phil Paleologos**

Phil Paleologos is the proud son of the late Rev. Father Nicholas and the late Presbytera Theodora {Talembecos} Paleologos. He entered broadcasting as a teenager in Hot Springs, Arkansas over 50 years ago and today continues to wake up the people of the South Coast in New Bedford, Massachusetts on WBSM 1420 AM. During his career at numerous stations, he anchored television news in Charlottesville, Virgina and was the afternoon host on WEZE Boston. Phil went on to become the morning anchor on the Talk America Radio Network that served over 200 markets nationwide. Phil balanced his broadcasting career while owning and operating the Shawmut Diner in New Bedford along with his wife Celeste. They have since donated the diner to the Bristol County House of Correction to eventually be used as a nonpublic working diner for inmates to get hands-on experience in the hospitality industry when they re-enter community life. Phil also volunteered to help addicted inmates get their lives back on track and was a charter member of a foundation that raised money for the local community health center. He has been acknowledged as a steward of the community by many nonprofit organizations and local government officials. Phil has been happily married for 41 years to Celeste {Barrett} Paleologos. Together, they have three adult children, Andrea, Athena, and Alex. They are the proud grandparents of eight grandchildren and one great grandchild. Phil is the brother of Father Dean and his wife Presbytera Cynthia {Kaloyanides} Paleologos; Neia Paleologos Rhodes; Gregory {deceased} and his wife Dorothy {Brous} Paleologos.

# The Metropolis of Boston Proudly Announces the Establishment and Awarding of Two New Scholarship Funds



# St. George's Hellenic Benefit Society of Tsamantas, Greece Scholarship Fund

The Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Boston is pleased to announce the launch of the Saint George's Hellenic Benefit Society of Tsamantas Scholarship Fund, which in its first year will award two scholarships for Greek-American college and graduate school students for the upcoming 2021-2022 academic year.

Known in Epirus as the 'village of benefactors', Tsamantas, a once-thriving mountainous village of more than 1,500 inhabitants located in the prefecture of Thesprotia, Epirus, today has a population of fewer than twenty residents. A large chain migration of young men from the village ventured to Worcester, MA at the turn of the 20th century seeking to forge a new life for their families. In 1908, some forty of these pioneers established one of the first Greek-American fraternal organizations in the United States – The St. George Hellenic Benefit Society of Tsamantas. Their aims were to assist their family and friends back in their home village, build the village's two schools and help establish the now long-thriving Greek Orthodox church and community in Worcester, MA. The new perpetual Scholarship Fund continues the Society's founders' storied tradition by aiding deserving Greek-American students in achieving their academic ambitions while also commemorating their ancestral village, its venerable Society and its many founders and benefactors for generations to come.

The first scholarship award is named in honor of Stavros Bellos, one of Tsamantas' native sons and the village's greatest benefactor, who bequeathed a very generous sum to the St. George's Society. This sum, together with other Society funds, have endowed a perpetual scholarship fund administered under the auspices of the Metropolis of Boston, continuing the long and fruitful leadership of His Eminence Metropolitan Methodios of New England. The second scholarship is in memory of Arthur Athanasiou, a former 61-year member of the St. George's Society who also served several tenures as President of the Society and was the driving force in establishing the Society's original scholarship program more than 30 years ago. The "Stavros Bellos Scholarship" will provide a \$7,500 award and the "Arthur Athanasiou Scholarship" a \$5,000 award.

The Inaugural Scholarship Award Winners for the Upcoming 2021-2022 Academic Year Are:

#### Elli Gurguliatos

Resident of Natick, MA., she matriculated at Natick High School, where she graduated with a 4.54 GPA. She has been accepted to Wellesley College, where she will be concentrating in Biology, Mathematics and Environmental Science.

#### **Anastasia Coclin**

Resident of Cranston, RI., and a graduate of Cranston High School West, where she graduated 13th in her class with a 4.775 GPA. She be entering Boston College in the Fall Semester, taking a double major Applied Psychology and Human Development & Transformative Educational Studies.





# **Charles C. Condes Memorial Scholarship Fund**

His Eminence Metropolitan Methodios announces that the Metropolis will be offering additional scholarship opportunities to Greek Orthodox college students, in furtherance of its long-standing and successful mission promoting engaging campus ministry throughout the college and graduate school years.

The Charles C. Condes Memorial Scholarships will be offered annually from funds granted to the Metropolis from the trust of Charles Constantine Condes to provide college student aid. In its inaugural year, two scholarship recipients will each receive \$7,500.

Charles Condes was born in Chicago, Illinois to Constantine S. and Harikleia (Yiannias) Condes who had emigrated from Niata, Lakonia and Alea, Arkadia, respectively. He was the third of their four children. The Great Depression was affecting millions of Americans while Condes was growing up. This didn't stop his ambition to be successful and at the young age of 16, he opened his own dairy store. Condes worked a series of additional jobs while attending the Illinois Institute of Technology as a first-generation college student. After receiving his Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering, Condes served in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II as a meteorologist, attached to the RAF. During the war he was stationed across North Africa, the Middle East, and Cyprus. After the war, he worked as an engineering consultant, including work as a bridge design engineer for the City of Chicago. In addition, by making many astute investments, he greatly expanded his personal fortune.

Charles was happily married for 25 years to the late Phyllis Holik. He was a highly principled man who was devoted to his family and his faith. A philanthropist who donated to many charities and churches, he was a great believer in the power of education and an admirer of all things Hellenic. Through his endowment of scholarships, he chose to demonstrate his pride in the Greek American students who represent the future of Hellenism and Orthodoxy in the United States.

# Rev. Dr. George Karahalios (Posthumously)



Saints Constantine and Helen Church of Andover is proud to honor the late Fr. George Karahalios as recipient from our parish for the 2021 Metropolis of Boston Ministry Award.

(Reposed September 8, 2015) The Rev. Dr. George Alexander Karahalios was a man of the cloth and a renaissance man, a teacher and scholar who was passionate about education, Hellenic language, culture,

and philanthropy. Besides his native Greek and English, he also spoke German, French, Latin, and Classical and Hellenistic Greek.

Father Karahalios was born September 22, 1931, in Athens, Greece, the fourth son of Irene and Alexandros Karahalios. He grew up in Athens during the Second World War, receiving his early and secondary education there. In 1953, at the age of 21, he came to the United States to attend the Holy Cross Greek Orthodox Theological School in Brookline, Massachusetts. In 1954, he married Calypso Arianoutsos, herself an immigrant from Greece. He was ordained as a Deacon on March 11, 1956, and to the Holy Priesthood on March 24, 1957.

# Dr. George and Dr. Maria Tsokos



Maria Tsokos, MD: Dr. Tsokos was born in Greece and received her Medical Degree and a Doctorate in Sciences from the National and Kapodistrian University in Athens. She trained in Anatomic Pathology at the Hellenic Red Cross Hospital in Athens and in the Laboratory of Pathology at the National Cancer

Institute, Bethesda, MD, where she also received postdoctoral training in ultrastructural pathology and solid pediatric tumors. Subsequently, Dr. Tsokos was appointed chief of the Pediatric Tumor Biology and Ultrastructural Pathology section at the National Cancer Institute, a position which she held for 23 years. She also became tenured senior investigator and led a research laboratory identifying previously unknown molecular pathways in sarcomas, which were explored in early phase clinical studies and hold promise for novel treatments. Dr. Tsokos also generated classification criteria for pediatric sarcomas and contributed to the identification of novel clinical entities. In 2012 she joined Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center as a research physician, and Harvard Medical School as a Professor in Residence of Medicine. She has served as a member and chair of committees in the Society for Pediatric Pathology and as academic editor and editorial board member in various scientific journals.

George C. Tsokos, MD: Dr. Tsokos was born in Greece and received his Medical Degree and a Doctorate in Sciences from the University of Athens. He trained in Internal Medicine at the University of Athens and Georgetown University/VA Medical Center in Washington DC and completed Immunology and Rheumatology Fellowships at the National Institutes of Health. Between 1987 and 2007, he was a member of the (continued)

Uniformed Services University/Walter Reed community, where he served in various leadership positions including: Professor of Medicine and Molecular/Cell Biology, Vice Chair for Research, Chief of the Department of Cell Injury, special consultant to the Surgeon General for vaccine side effects, and appointee of the Secretary of Defense to the Council of the National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal Diseases. In 2007 he joined the Beth Israel Medical Center as Chief of Rheumatology and Clinical Immunology and Harvard Medical School as Professor of Medicine. He conducts basic and clinical research in patients with systemic lupus erythematosus and has identified novel pathways that have served as the basis for new treatments currently in various phases of development. More recently, he has launched studies to decipher the interaction between immune and kidney resident cells and to identify local processes that enable kidney damage. Dr. Tsokos has served in various leadership positions, including: President of the Clinical Immunology Society, the member of the Boards of Directors for the American College of Rheumatology and the Lupus Foundation of America, member or chair of multiple federal committees, and editor or member of the editorial boards for top scientific journals. He holds a MERIT Award from the National Institutes of Health and has received several prestigious awards including: the Kirkland, Lee C. Howley Sr. Prize, and Evelyn V. Hess awards; the Distinguished Basic Investigator Award from the American College of Rheumatology; the Lupus Insight Prize from the Lupus Research Alliance; the Carol Nachman Prize for Rheumatology; and the Dr. Marian Ropes Physician Achievement Award. He is a Master of the American College of Physicians and the American College of Rheumatology. \*

### **Nicholas Rorris**


